Course Description & Objectives

In this semester long course, we will study a wide variety of films; we will also study the characteristics of the film medium and how they apply to films studied in the course. Emphasis will be on critically analyzing and interpreting film. In addition, this course will have a pop culture "trivia" component. We will talk about directors, musicians, actresses, actors, academy awards, etc. Understanding of film techniques and literary analysis will be demonstrated through a variety of written and oral responses, and two individual studies. Often a "Worksheet" will accompany a film with the intended outcome to be observation/analysis of some intended element.

Five things that I care immensely about and always focus on:

- 1. Respect yourself, others, others' belongings, and the school
- 2. Accountability for one's self and one's actions
- 3. Critical Thinking
- 4. Ask the important questions
- 5. Student advocacy vs guardian advocacy

Behavioral Expectations: Every student in Douglas County is expected to comply with the *Douglas County School District Student Code of Conduct and Discipline*. Breach of this conduct will result in disciplinary action. This includes no food/drink in the classroom. Of course, water is acceptable, but no McDonald's feasts! No cell phone use either. I will confiscate cell phones and give to administration.

Makeup work: Accepted for excused absences only, within the time period designated by Douglas County School District policy. This equates to one day per day missed plus an additional day. For instance, if you miss two days due to illness, you would have three days to complete work. It is your responsibility to find out what you missed. Films missed due to absences will have to be viewed at school; I do not check out films to students.

Tardies: If you are not in your seat when the bell rings, you are tardy. Our time together is important. I will begin instruction as soon as the bell rings. We will often start with a "bell assignment." If you have an unexcused tardy and miss the assignment, it cannot be made up. Other consequences: please refer to the **Rock Canyon tardy policy (also defined on wall).**

Late Work: No Late Work Allowed.

Academic Dishonesty: Academic dishonesty includes plagiarism, cheating on tests, copying papers, forging the signatures of teachers and/or parents on any document, or illegally changing a grade. Students will face disciplinary action (referral to office) in all cases involving academic dishonesty. In cases of academic dishonesty on an assignment, including plagiarism or copying, your grade will be an automatic zero.

Grades: Your grades will be a compilation of points from homework, class work including discussion participation, tests & quizzes, and various writing assignments. Grades will be based on the percentage of points possible using the following scale.

A 90-100 B 80-89 C 70-79 D 60-69 F 0-59

The Final Exam for the semester will be weighted to contribute 15% of your total grade. A 9-week participation grade will be assigned worth 20% of your total grade, and the other 65% will come from tests/quizzes/assignments. In other words, 85% of the total grade is comprised of total points across all participation/activities throughout the semester, and the other 15% comes from your semester final. Participation scores (out of 100) are evaluated based on timeliness to class, appropriate viewing of films (no phones/no sleeping), and contribution to class discussion.
